Consultancy Work

In September 2004 and in July-August 2005 I undertook two studies on women, empowerment and solidarity issues in urban and rural Bangladesh, for CARE Bangladesh.
In May 2001 I was part of a team undertaking a mid-term review of SHAPLA, an extensive series of projects which makes up DFID's contribution to the large-scale reform of Government of Bangladesh's Health and Population Sector Programme.
In December 2000-January 2001 I contributed a Background Essay on 'Gender Dimensions of Rural Change' as part of the Livelihoods and Institutions Assessments for the DFID (Bangladesh) Natural Resources [NR]/Fisheries and Aquatic Resources [FAR] Programmes.
March-April 2000 DFID (UK Department of International Development) team project, 'Review of Big NGOs in Bangladesh'. The purpose of the review was to take stock of the experience of DFID and other organisations working with the bigger NGOs in the areas of advocacy, service delivery and empowerment, in order to identify lessons for future collaboration in helping to eliminate poverty in Bangladesh. I was particularly concerned with gender aspects of the review.
I acted for some years as a consultant for Parish Patience, a group of solicitors in Sydney involved in migration consultancy, on cases in relation to their Bangladeshi or other South Asian clients. I wrote reports on such cases and appeared where necessary before the Immigration Tribunal.

Teaching
